How will you let me know how my child is doing throughout the year?



There are 4 key ways in which we will keep you informed of how your child is doing during the year:

- 1 Sharing the curriculum and lesson content with you
- 2. Via parents' evenings and via the summer term school report.
- 3. By sharing assessment information with you
- 4. Through informal communication at the doors and via phone or Arbor emails when needed.

Parents of children with additional needs have an extra x2 contact points with class teachers (minimum) throughout the year to review targets on Provision Map.

1. Long Term Curriculum Map

We want to keep you well-informed of what your child will be studying this year ahead of the lessons beginning.

1. We will share the Long Term overview for the year with you to let you know what topics your child will be taught and when.

2. We will now show you how to find further detail and specific lesson content on our school website. (Show example on School curriculum tab)

2. Parent Evenings

Optional Parent evening drop-in session on the Wednesday after reports go out in the summer term. This session is for if you feel you need to discuss anything raised in the report.

3. Assessment Weeks

Assessments are a key tool in finding out what strengths children have and what areas they need to develop further.

Assessments help to identify gaps in knowledge so that teachers can plan their future lessons. For example, if a whole class is struggling on the "fractions" element of maths, more lessons will focus on this. If all the class score well on times table questions, less time needs to be given to this.

Our internal assessments are "low stakes" and we approach them positively with the children.


