

<u> Otis - Owls</u>


Otis has a super attitude towards school and is trying hard in everything we do. This week he has surprised himself with the improvement in his handwriting!






Finches – Billy


Brooklyn – Cranes



You always listen attentively, take on board suggestions and use them in your work. Keep it up Evie-Leigh!




<u>Ted - Falcons</u>

Macie-Woodpeckers





Keep it up Lucas – I have been really impressed this week.




<u>Ava-Falcons</u>
