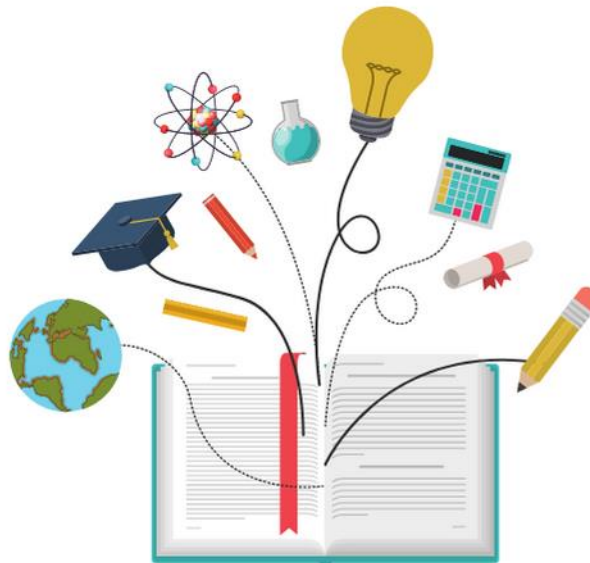

Year 1

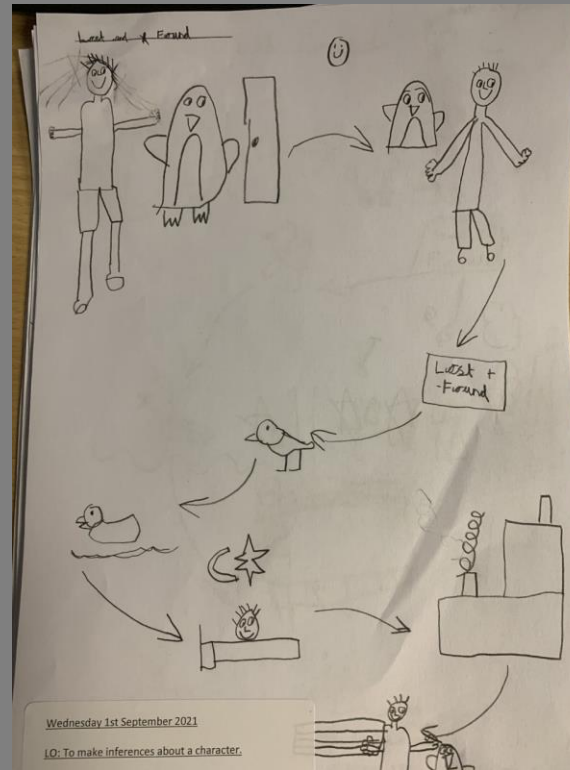
Arlo - Owls

Harry T – Cranes

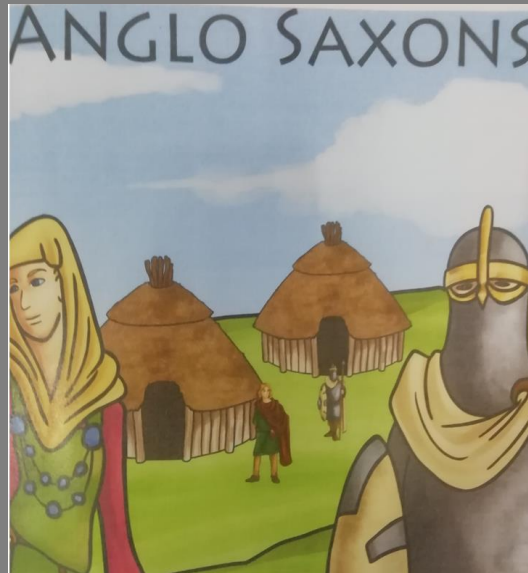
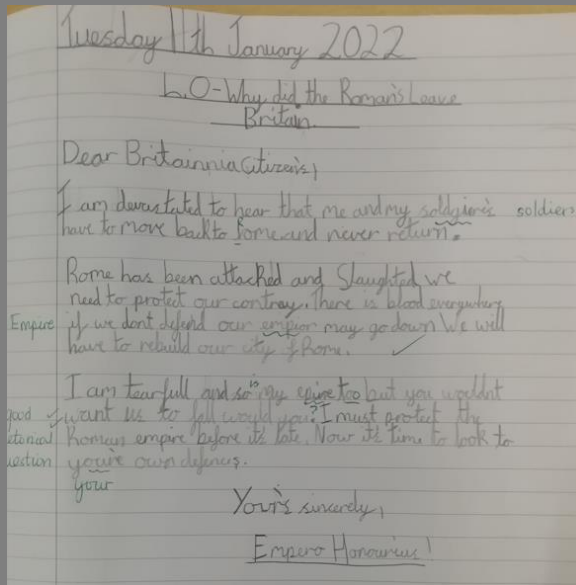

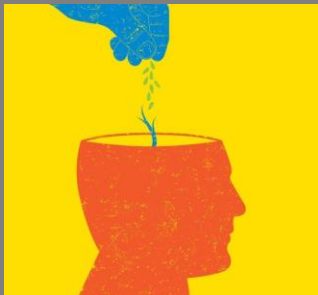
Year 5

George has shown many of our school values this week and is a polite and respectful member of our class. He is a good role model to others and always makes the right choices.

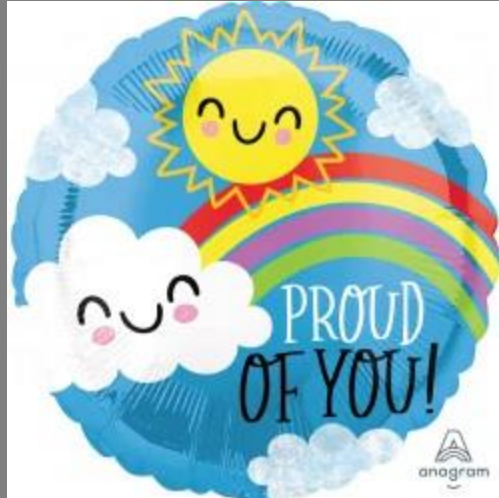
He is kind, helpful and compassionate too. Well done George you are a superstar!

She is a great friend and always tries to make good choices with her behaviour and attitude.

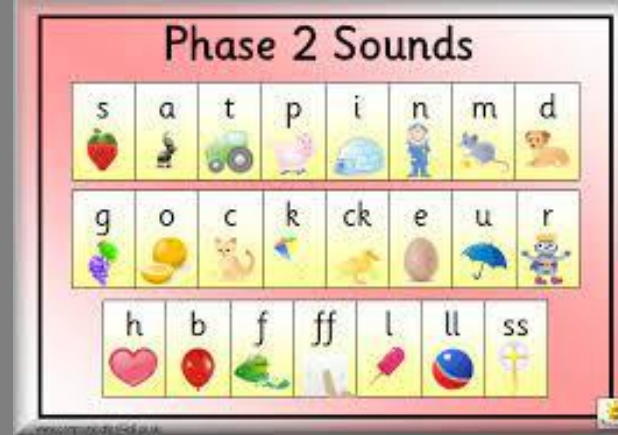
Although she doesn't always find the work easy, Penelope will always endeavour to strive for excellence.

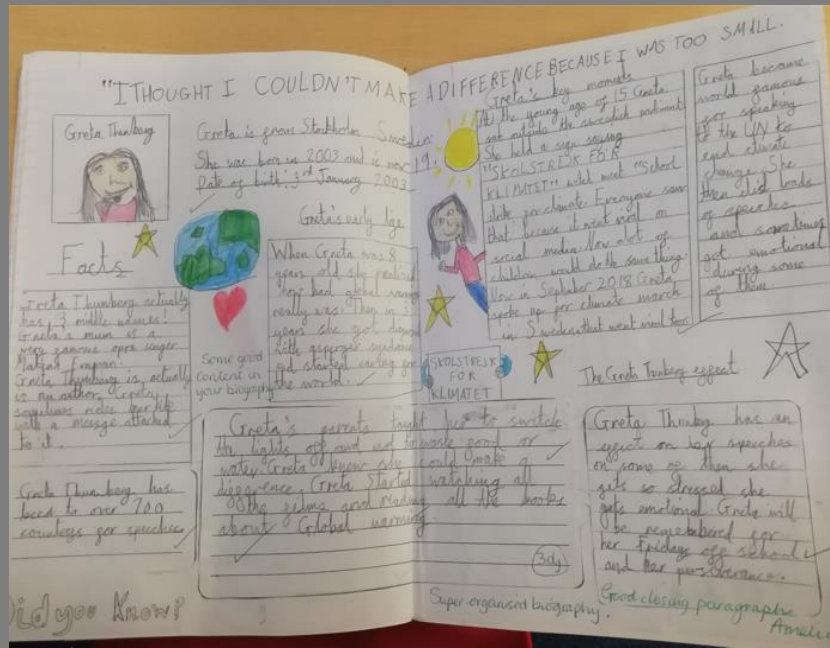


Lucas- Hawks
