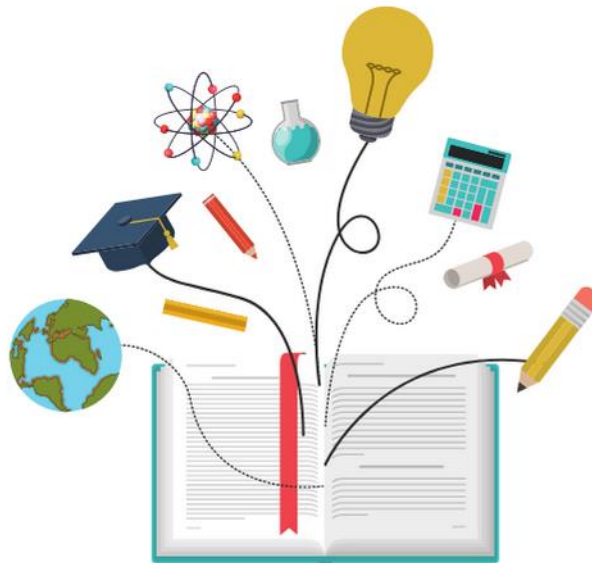

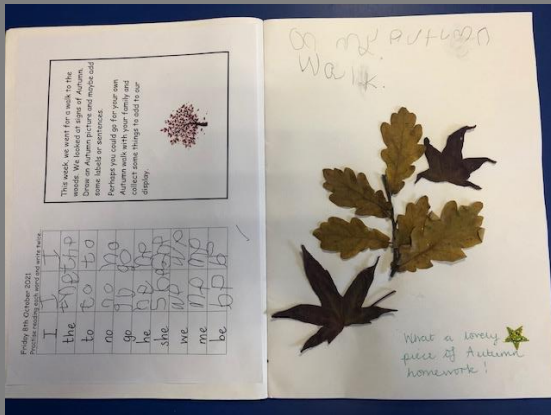


Year 1

Wrens – Jacob

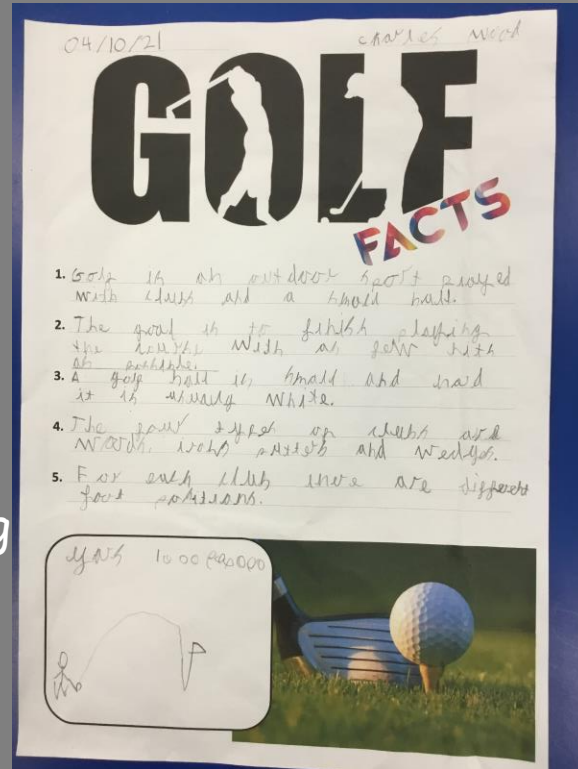

Year 3

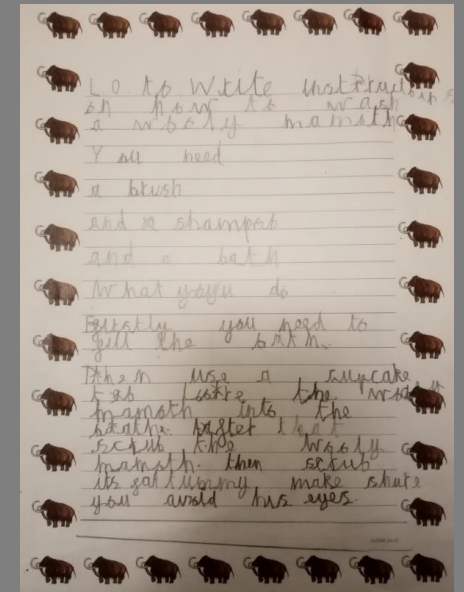
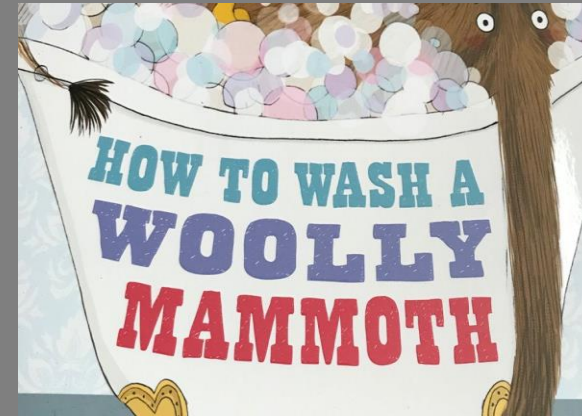
Charles Jackdaws

Cody – Cranes

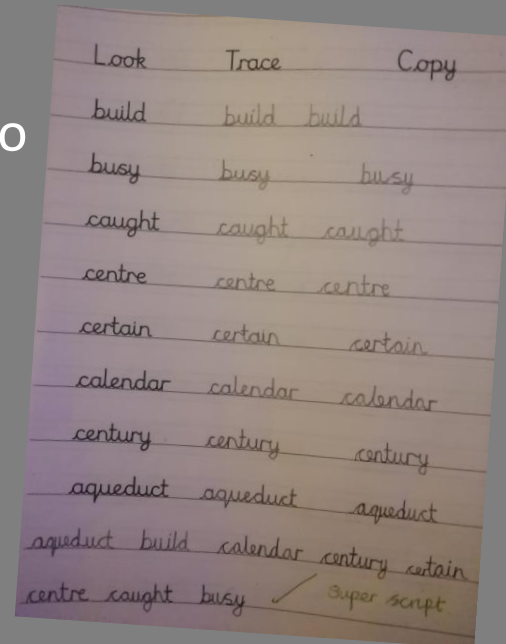
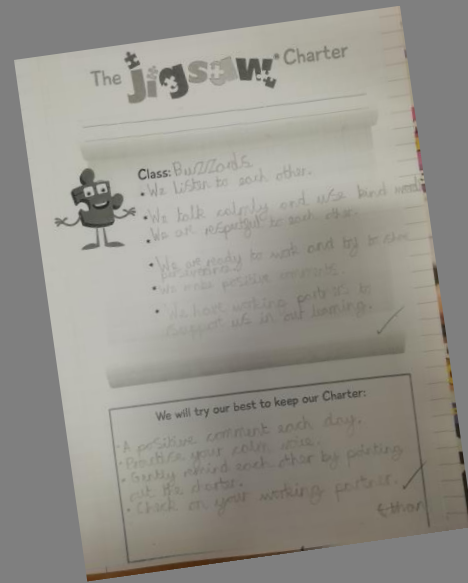
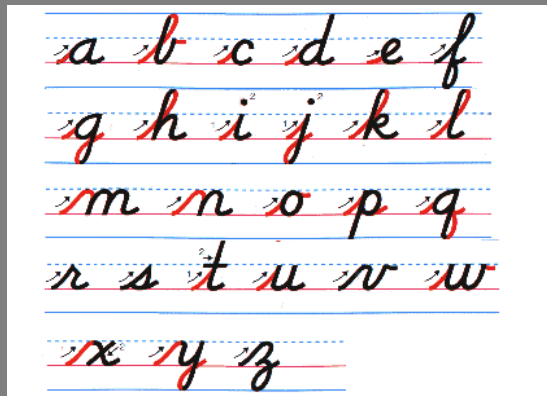

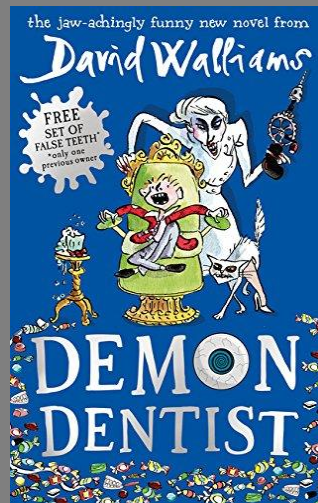
Year 5

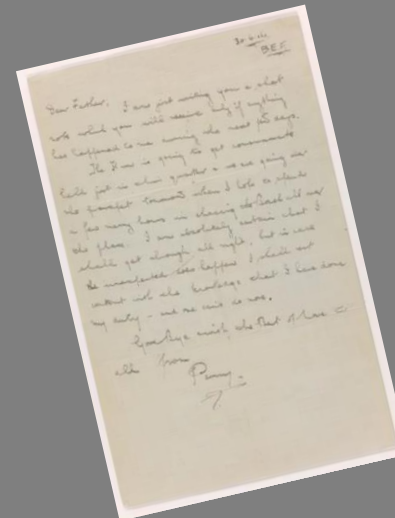
His hardworking attitude is beginning to shine in all areas of the curriculum.

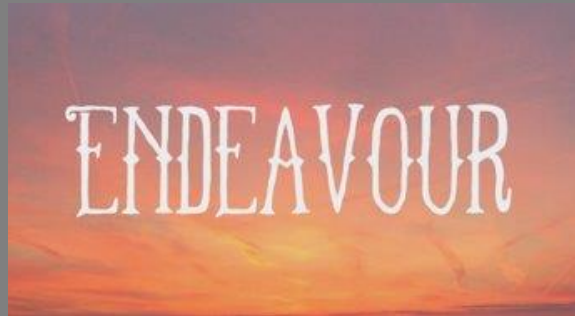
As Mr Simpson puts it, Carter most definitely dances like there is nobody in the room! Keep being brave in all your learning Carter.
