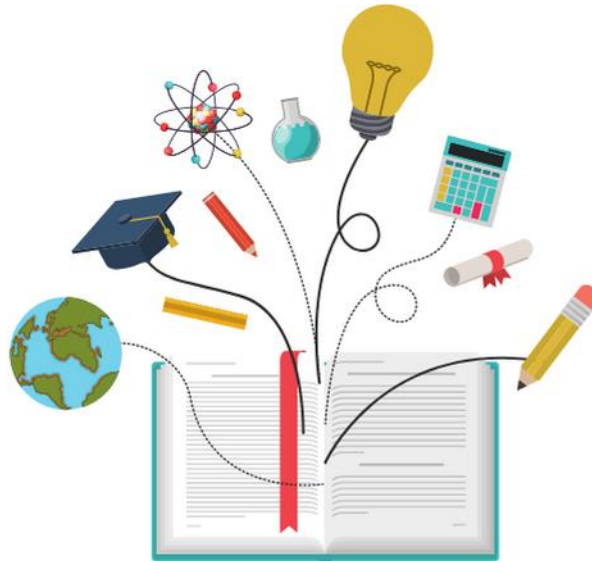

Finches – Toby



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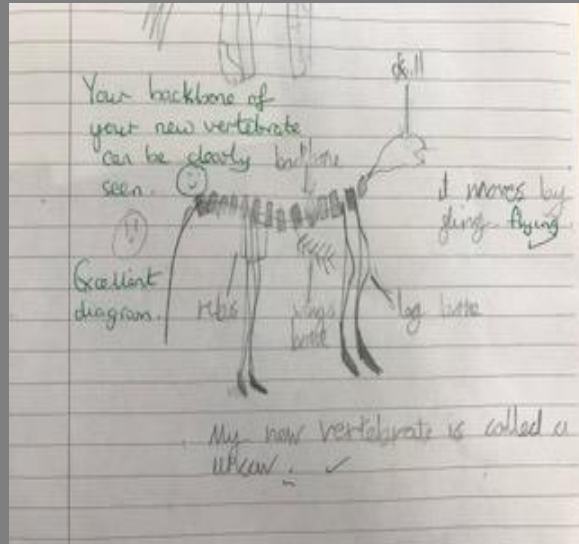
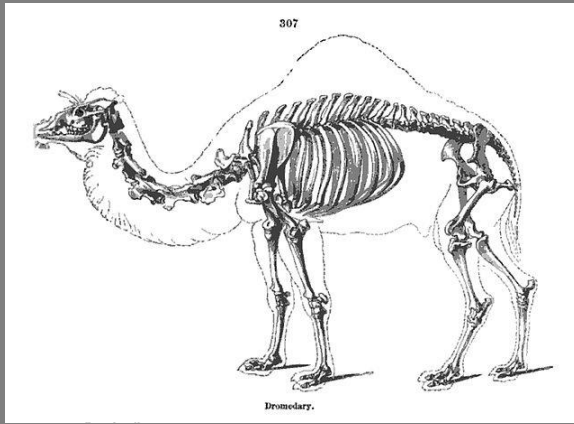


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Year 3

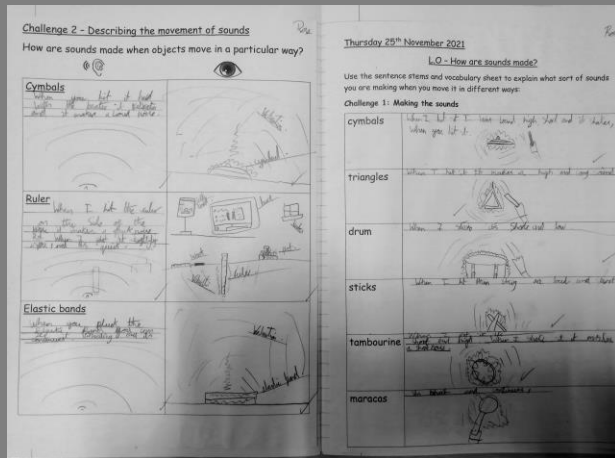


Year 4

Year 5



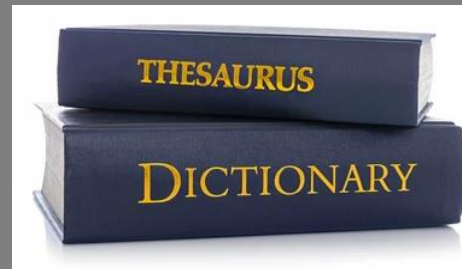
Jorge – Ospreys

Christian – Woodpeckers

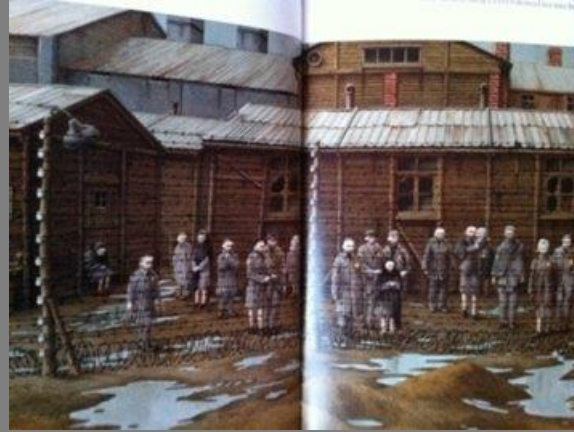

Year 4

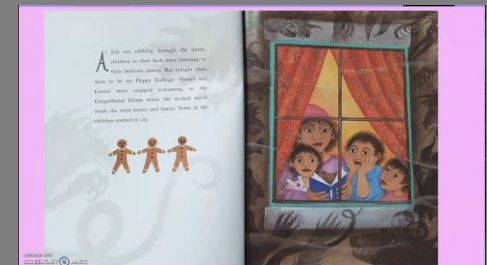
Thanus – Buzzards
