
Ella-Rai

Well done Harry, we are very proud of you.




Finches – Brooklyn

Vlad the flea is telling us the story!


Jack you have amazed us with your written work this week. You have written questions for Vlad and Boxton and sentences using an adverb.

could clearly explain her reasons whilst also presenting her work beautifully! You are a fantastic historian, Isla. Great work!








Kia – Cranes






Amelia- Hawks

Well done Jessica.




Woodpeckers – Georgia

Convert $\frac{20}{3}$ to a mixed number

Divide the numerator by the denominator $20 \div 3 = 6$ plus 2 remainder $\frac{20}{3} = 6\frac{2}{3}$ 6 becomes the whole number
2 is the numerator of the fraction as shown
3 is the denominator

It is an absolute pleasure to teach Ellie – a true Feniscowles Child!




Sparrows - Aria

It has been a tricky week in Wrens with no Mrs Henry.


The adults working in Wrens have spotted Demi this week as she always does the right thing.
