




EYFS

What an amazing opener!






Wrens – Luna






Charles-Jackdaws




Kenzie – Buzzards




Robins – Bailey

This week Ariana has had her head screwed on!


What an amazing attitude towards her work. Showing endeavour in all that she does.

Well done Lucas – you have shown yourself to be a super Feniscowles child this week.






Sam - Falcons
