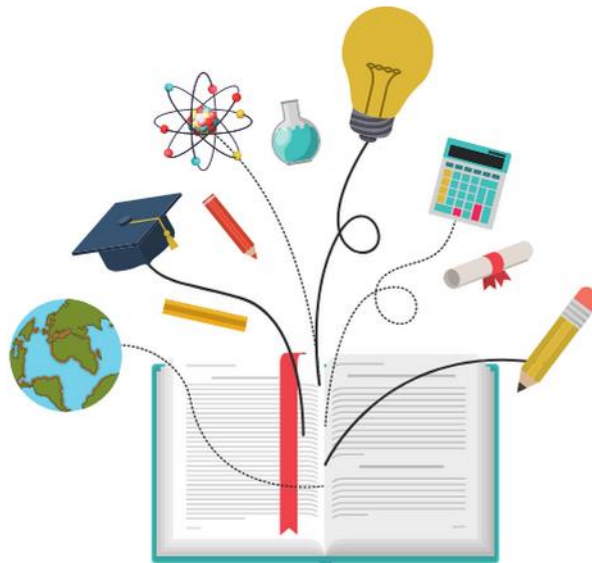

Year 1

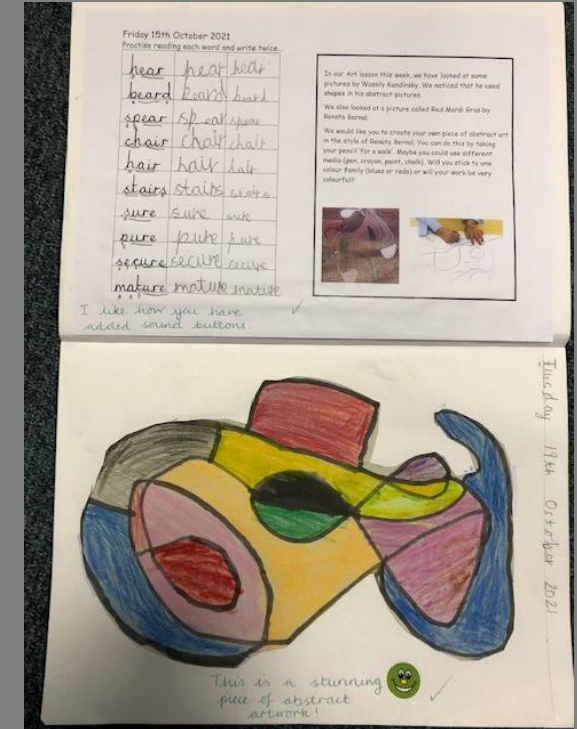
Sparrows – Evelyn

It tickles like a ballerina dancing.



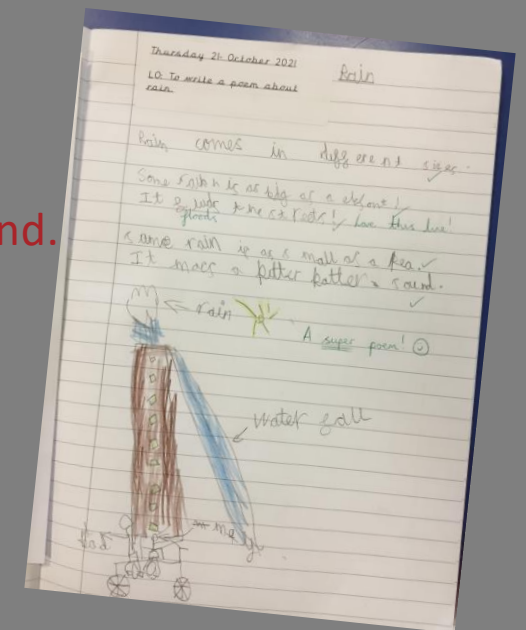
Wrens – Robert

My favourite lines would be:

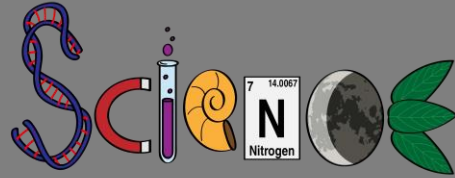
Some rain is as small as a pea.

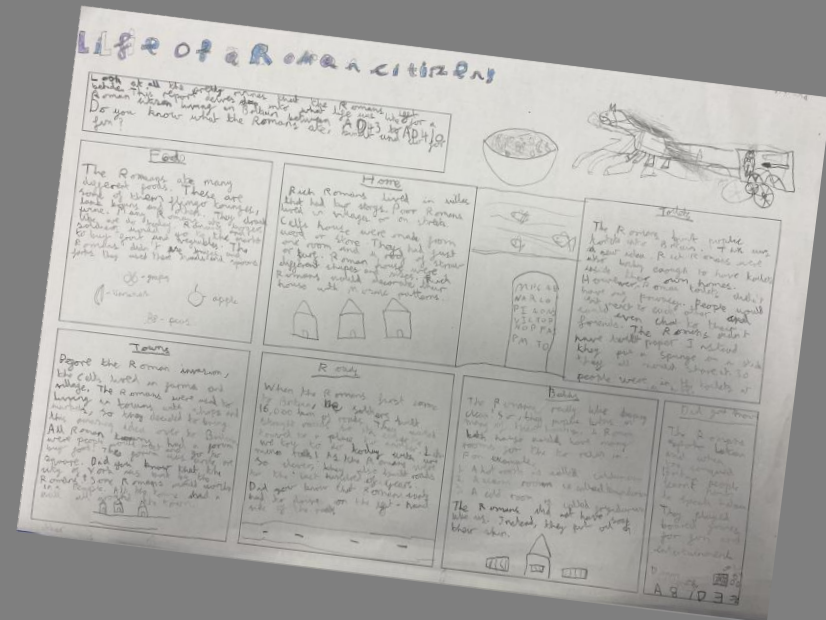
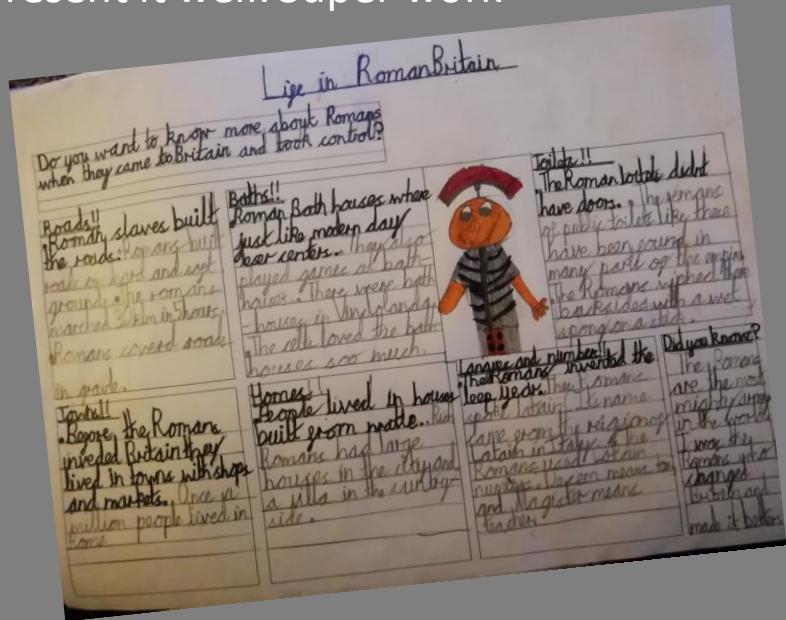


Amelia- Hawks

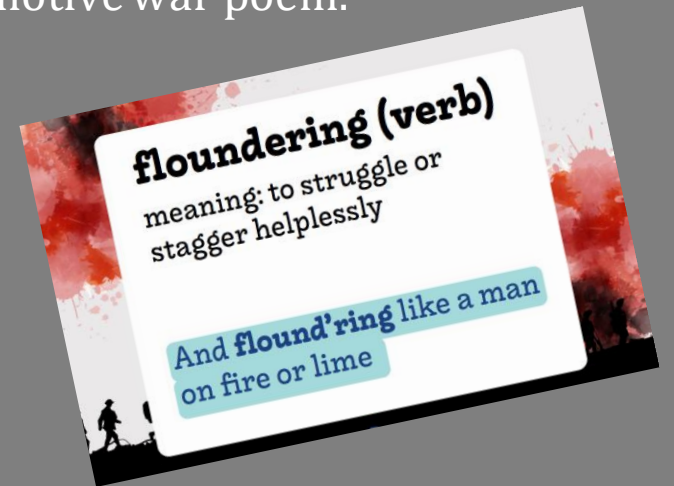
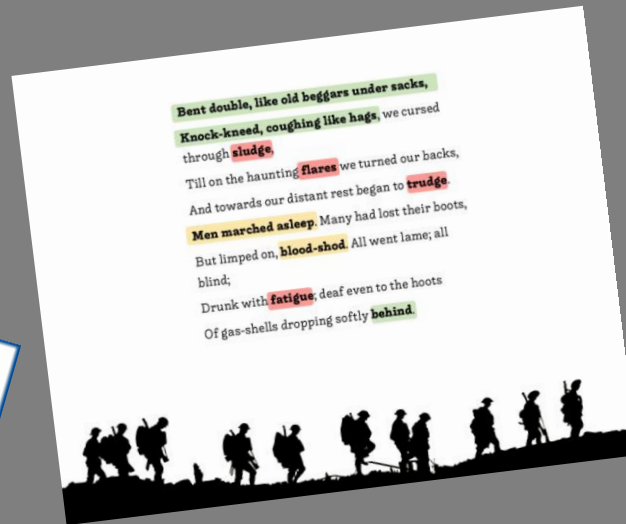
Lucas - Falcons

We have been looking at the school value of compassion over the half term in our RE work, talking about how different people show compassion. Mother Theresa being a person that has shown compassion.

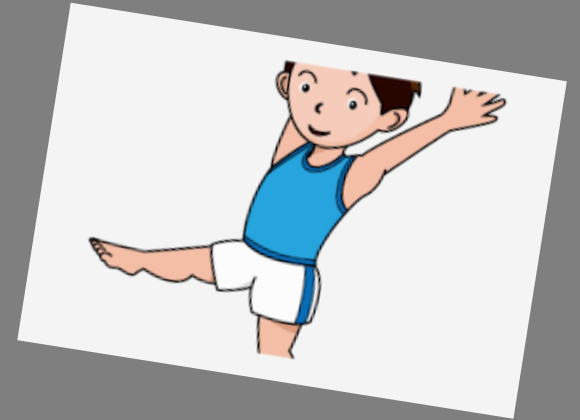
This week we spotted Charlie being compassionate towards a class member that was struggling with her buttons. What a fantastic value to have and show.

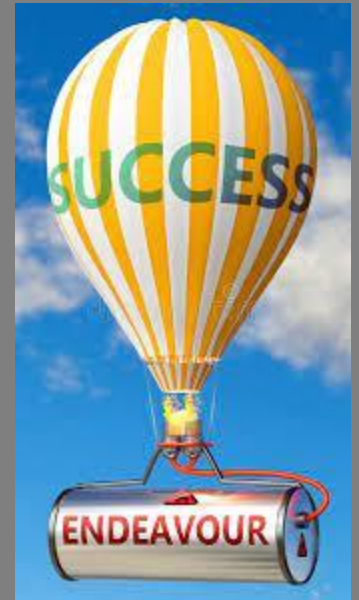


Thank You For Being So Kind

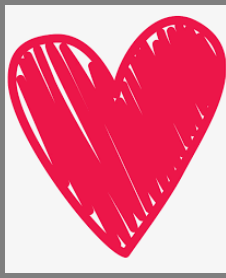


Maggie- Hawks

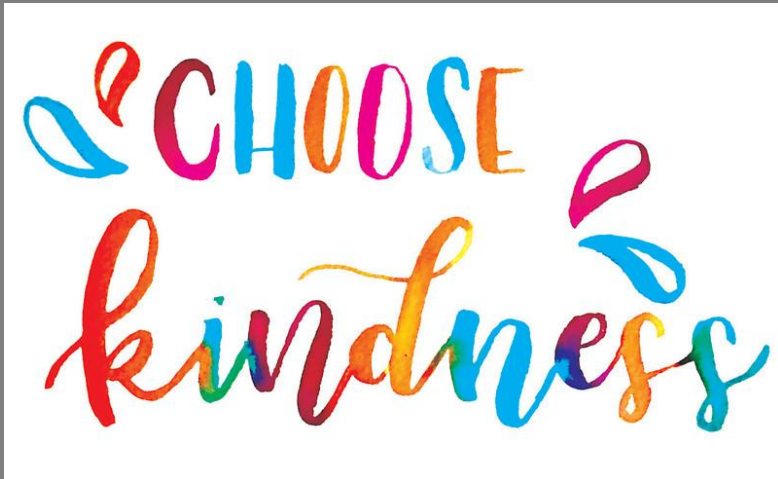


Year 5

She endeavours to be the best she can be and aims to make the most of every opportunity that comes her way. For that I am really proud of her.

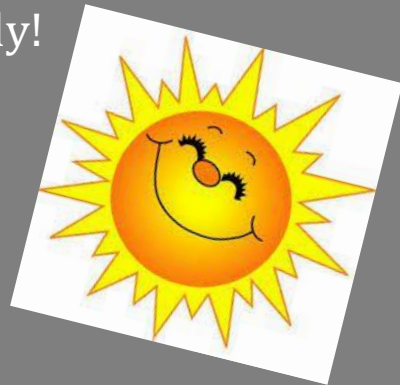
