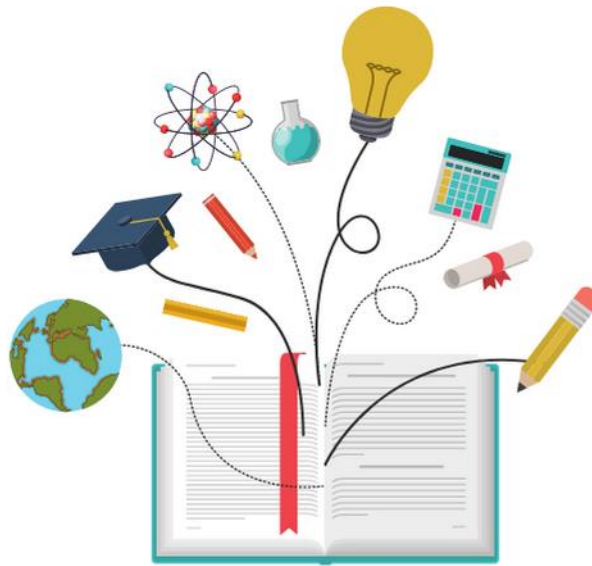

Keep this up Penelope – you are setting such a good example for the rest of Year 1.



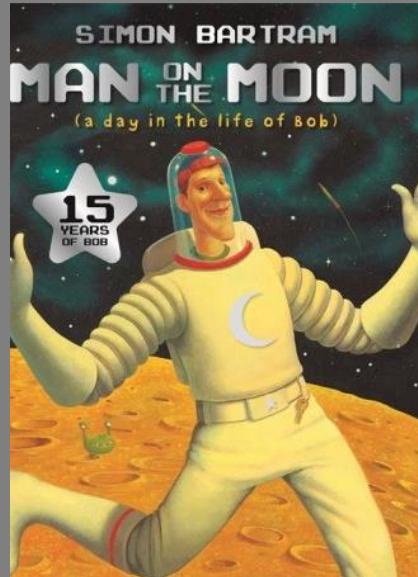
Year 2

Well done, Leila.

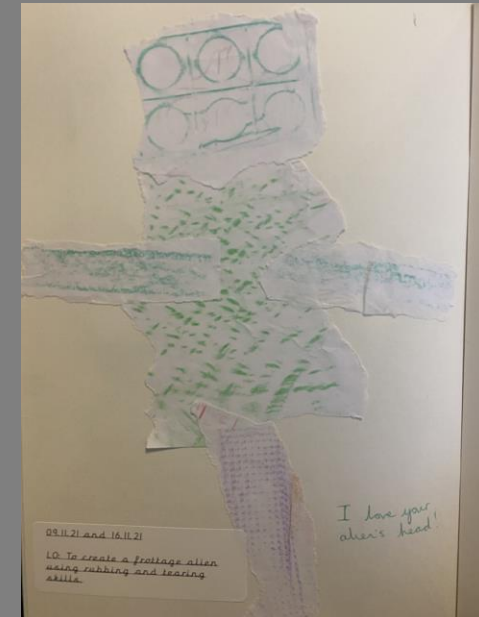


Wrens - Poppy

Year 3

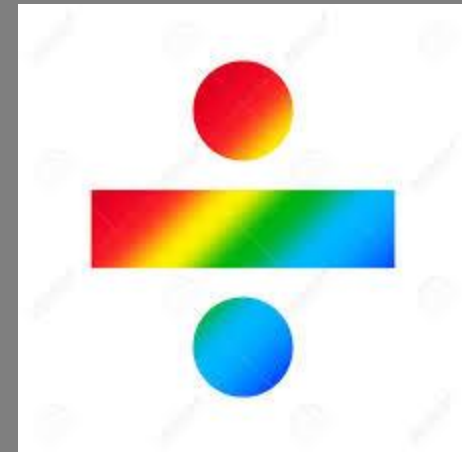
Ralph - Jackdaws

Year 4

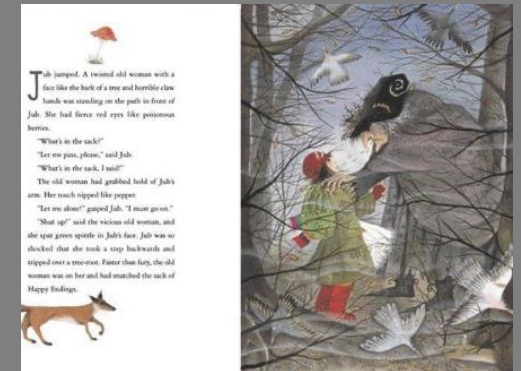
Monty – Buzzards

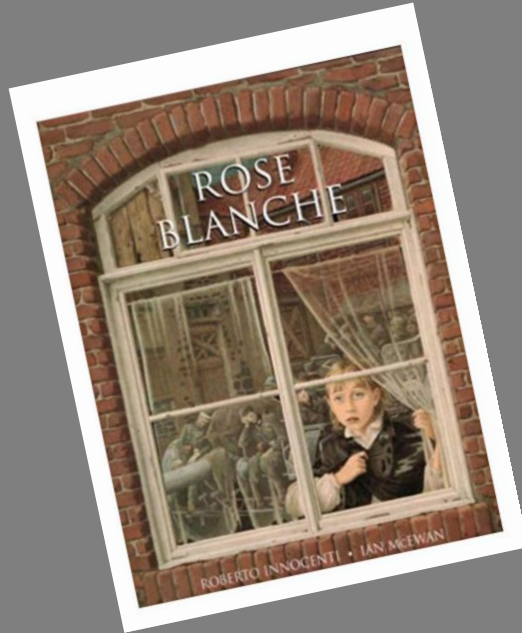

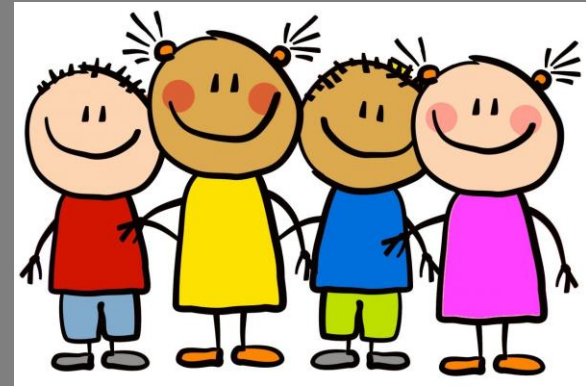


Jays – Oscar
