




Striving for Excellence in our work.


Year 1

She remembered the skills we had learnt in DT last week and has even written some instructions.


Sophie has such a positive attitude to learning!

Year 2


Finches – Gracie

In English Gracie has shown great stamina in her writing of Boxton's Diary entry.


We are very proud of you, Gracie.

Lacey has tried to be more independent with her writing. Rather than waiting for an adult to help her with ideas, she put pencil to paper straight away and showed super focus.


We really hope she can keep this up!



Year 3


Oscar-Jackdaws

Robyn – Cranes



Divine – Buzzards




Ben- Hawks

Well done Evie!






It has been wonderful to listen to Robert read this week. He showed lots of enthusiasm and endeavour, whilst reading a book all about climbing Mount Everest!


He was bursting to tell me all the facts that he had learnt. Your love of learning is infectious Robert – well done!

Jacob – Cranes



Queen Elizabeth – Jubilee Celebration




On Sunday **6th February 2022**, Her Majesty The Queen, became the first British Monarch in history to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, after 70 years of service.




Our house event will be...
