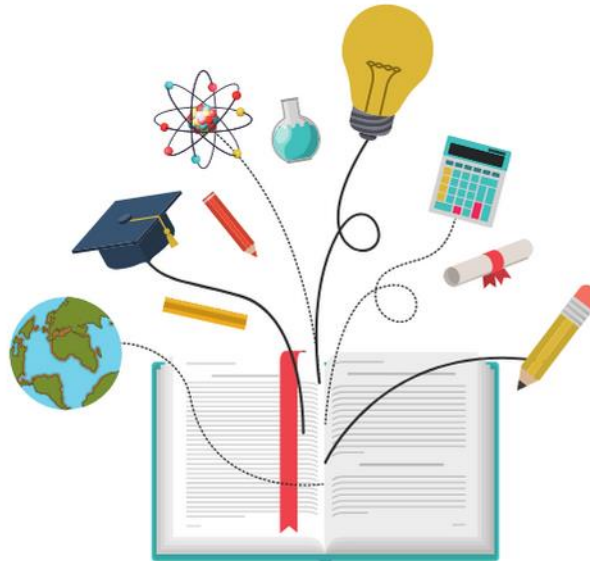

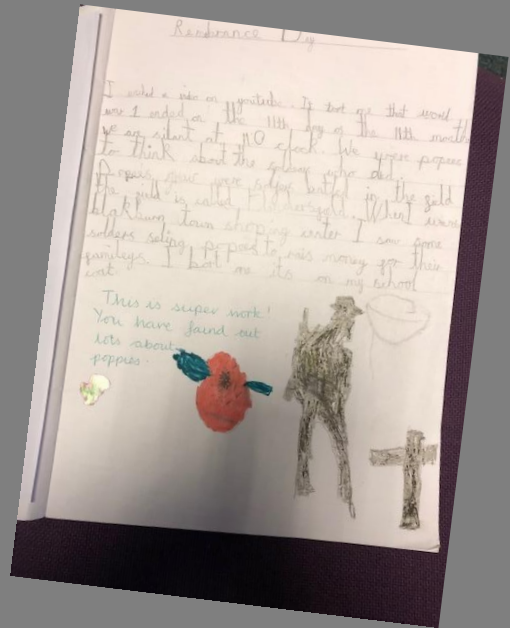
## Robins - Ted Houston

# Year 1

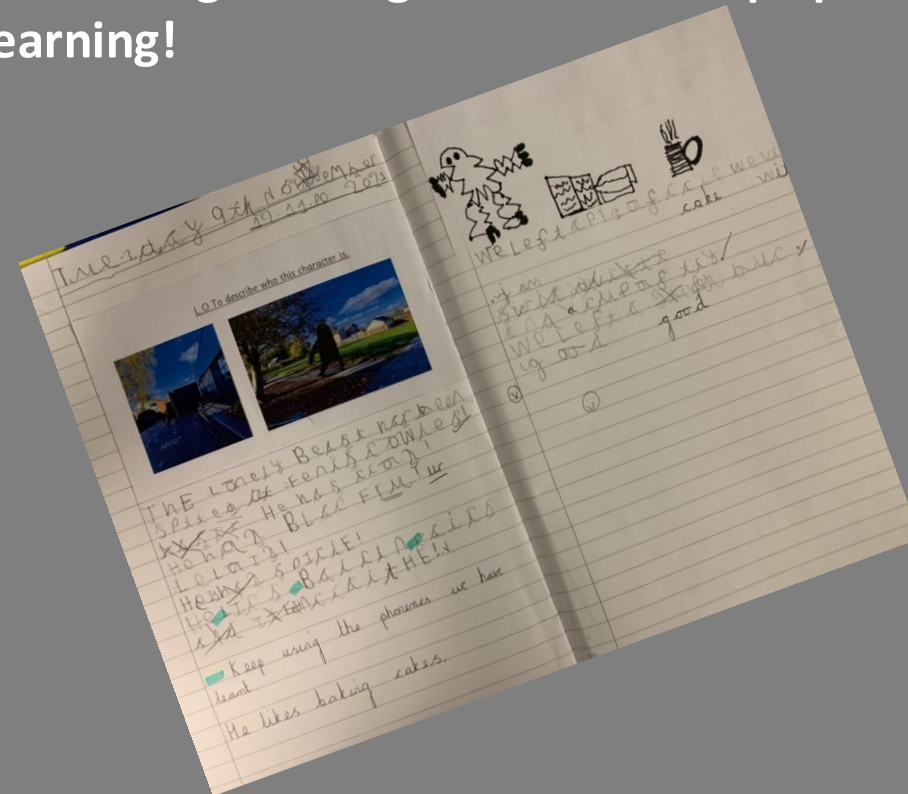
## Owls – Noah

## Finches – Elsa

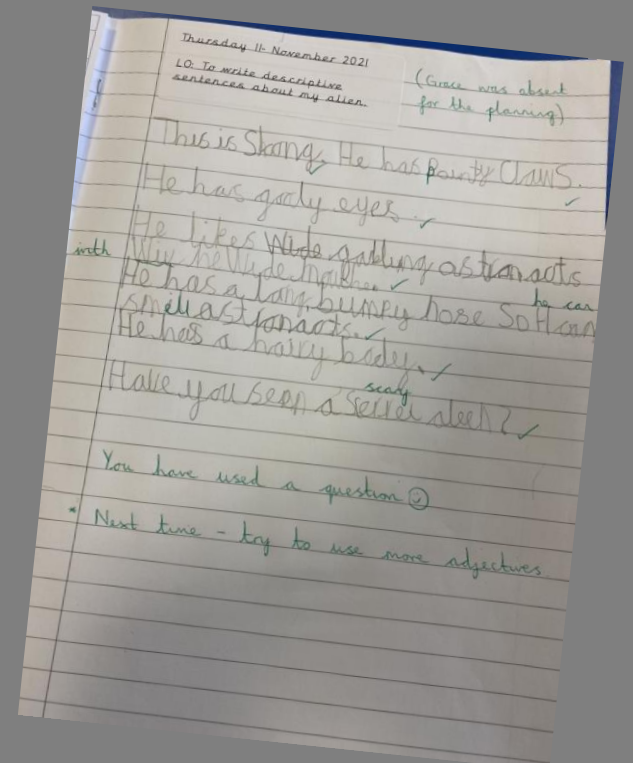
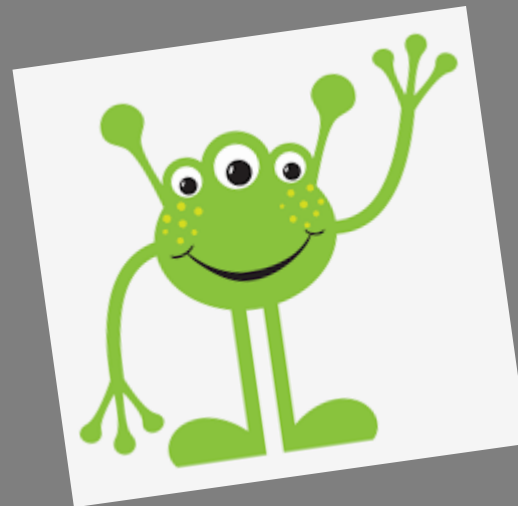

## Wrens – Grace

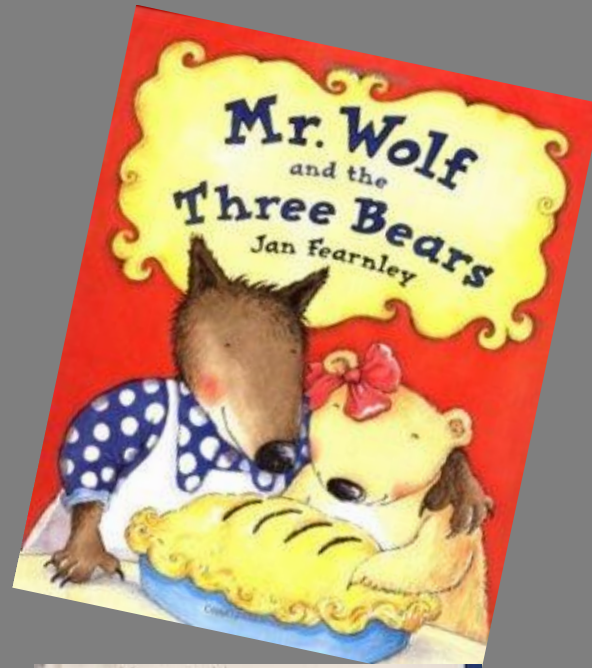

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## Oscar – Cranes

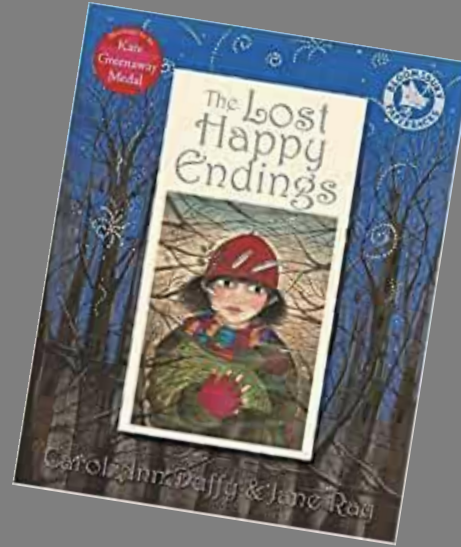
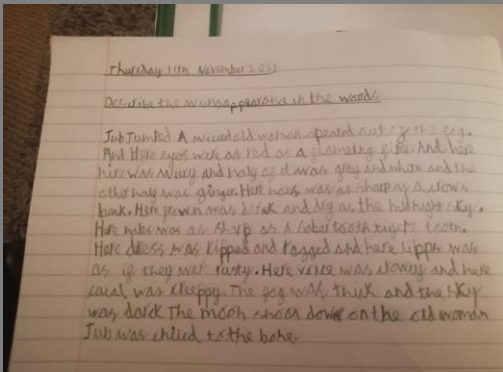

## Owls – Heidi

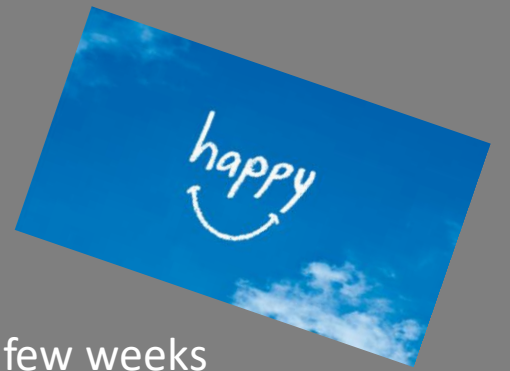

## Wrens - Jake

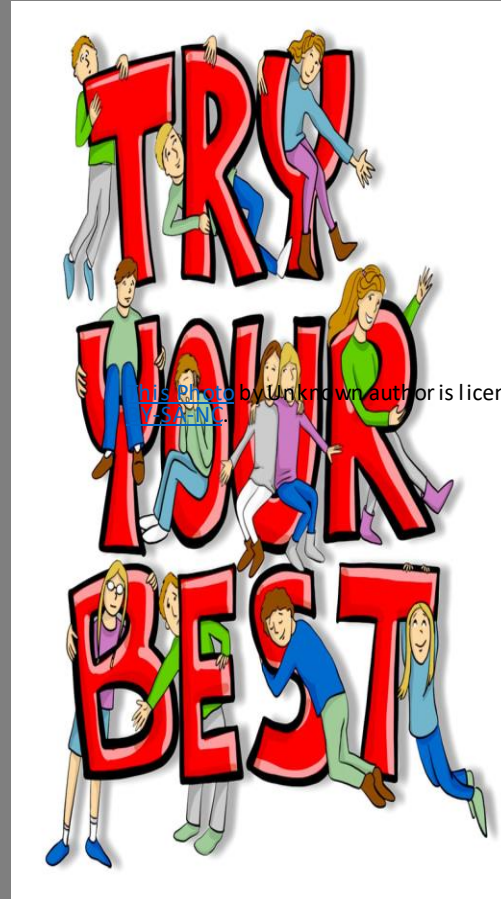

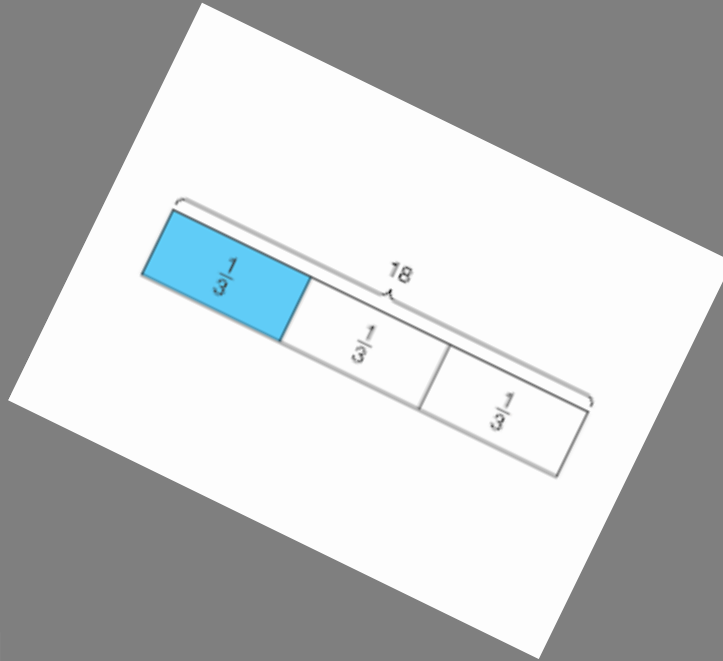


# Year 6
