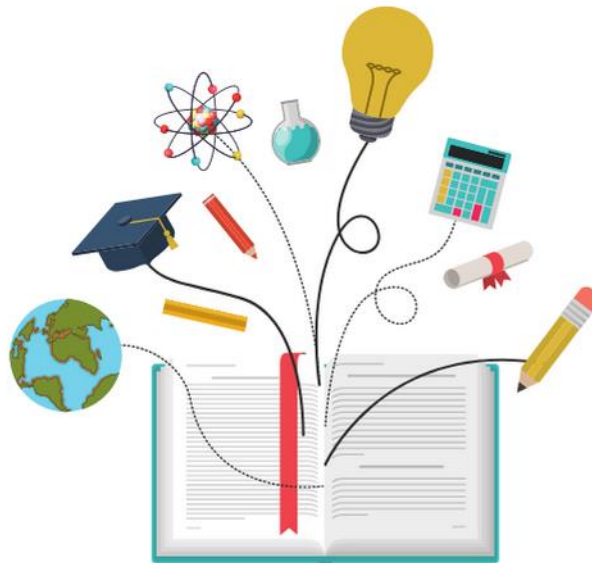

Not only is she trying to improve her handwriting and presentation of work, she has also remembered some important vocabulary in our DT lesson.

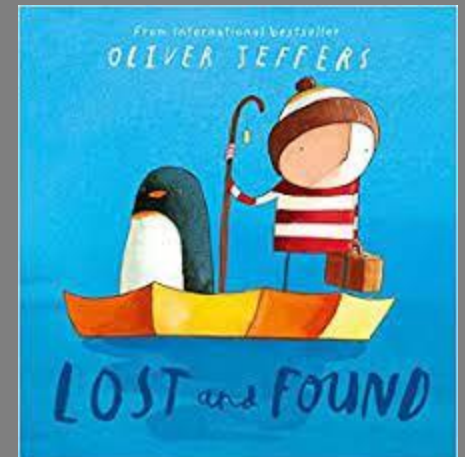
We didn't have time to evaluate our finished product before the holiday. Lola remembered the names of the three parts of our windmills!

## Wrens - Jacob

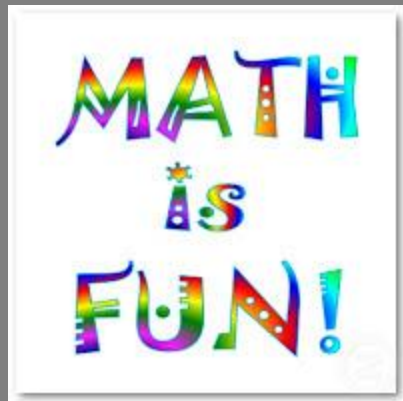
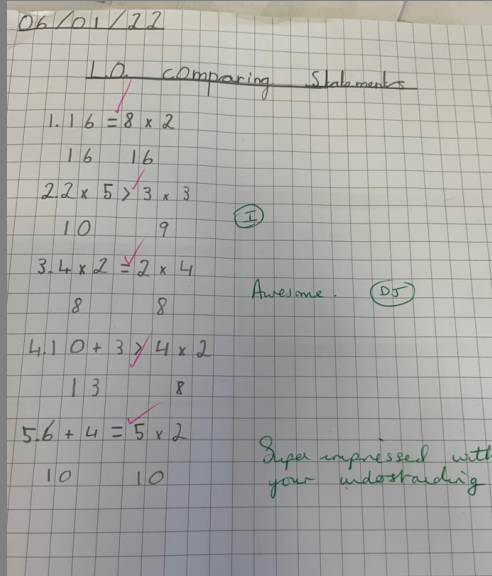

## Rehan-Jackdaws

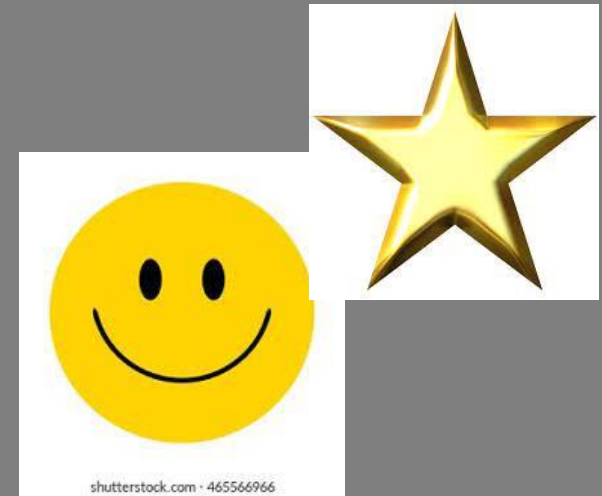

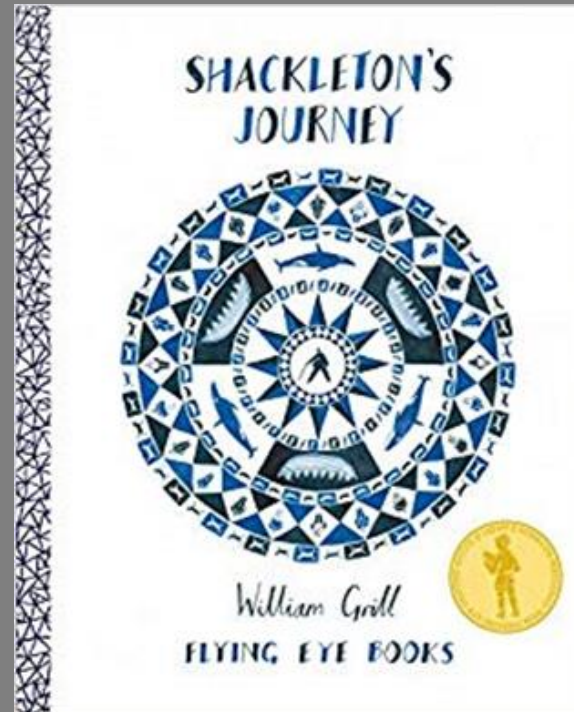


# Year 6
