Feniscowles Primary School is a member of the Youth Sport Trust. To develop a clear understanding of our current provision and performance we utilise their Sports Mark Audit tool and their Sports Premium Toolkit. This allows us to reflect on what we do well and what we can further enhance. At Feniscowles Primary School, we wish to create an 'Active School' that promotes wellbeing and a love for active lifestyles. We also work closely with the School Games Partnership staff to establish best practice within our region and create strong professional networks.

Sports Coach Provision

Why do we utilise a sports coach within school?

We want to create a sporting culture within our school, as we believe this will allow our learners to flourish now and in later life. The impact this has on physical and mental wellbeing is significant. We also believe in the power of sport and PE as a vehicle for exceptional character development, and see it as an essential aspect of becoming 'A Feniscowles Child' as defined in our curriculum aims document.

With this as our focus we make the choice to invest in a full time sports coach to work with us. This serves to increase expertise to support staff development and add capacity to the provision for our learners. As some learners claim to not like PE and see themselves as 'not good enough', we believe having our own specialist coach provides a binding relationship between the school curriculum and enrichment provision. Trust can be built and consistency achieved. This is particularly critical to support SEND learners accessing wider opportunities.

We utilise a proportion of our PE and Sport Premium to pay for part of the coach's salary. This covers the enhancements in line with this action plan. We have noted in priority 3 that £15k is allocated to this. Where the coach is fulfilling other actions within this plan, the cost has been recorded as £Coach, to show it is funded from this partially salary commitment
